Santa Special Trains - would your child like to help us?

You may be aware that the Kent and East Sussex Railway is a volunteer run, educational charity. During December, we operate our very popular "Santa Special" service. Trains travel between Tenterden and Northiam Stations with Santa and his team of elves distributing presents to each child at their seat. The purpose of this letter is to invite your son or daughter to assist us as an Elf this December.

A typical day will start one hour before the first train departs (certainly no earlier than 09:30am). When they arrive and sign in they will be introduced to their team and their team leader (Staff Member of KESR) - who will be co-ordinating their tasks for the day. This team will stay together for the entire day. They will then change into their costumes and help to load the train with presents. They do not need any special clothing but we would prefer black shoes (no trainers), dark trousers and a top to wear under the "Christmas jumpers" we will be giving them to wear. Hats with ears will also be provided for them to wear. A food voucher will be provided to each child per day.

When the train departs, they follow Santa through the train, listening to the answers each child gives to Santa and handing Santa the correct present from their own sack.
