## **Churchill Class Update**

Churchill class is keen to share with you all the exciting learning that has taken place this term.

With the rest of Key Stage 2, we have continued to learn about the Tudors. We have carried out research on Henry VIII using a range of resources. We learnt about Henry VIII's hobbies; the reasons behind the dissolution of the monasteries; and how the monies raised were used to increase the size of the Navy and to build his famous flagship 'The Mary Rose'. We have also been learning about the reign of Queen Elizabeth 1st and the defeat of the Spanish Armada.



To end our topic on the Tudors we designed our own board games.

In English we have been studying Macbeth. In drama, we have participating in role play using intonation, volume and movement to recreate Macbeth and Banquo first meeting the three witches. We have also been using different types of figurative language to describe settings and looking at features of play scripts.



In Maths, we have been learning about properties of 2D shape, measuring and drawing different types of angles and constructing triangles. We have also been learning how to draw and interpret pie charts. Practising our arithmetic skills in readiness for SATs has also been part of our maths lessons along with developing strategies when tackling problem solving activities.

## **Churchill Class Update Cont...**

In Science, we have been planning and carrying out investigations which have required excellent observational, predicting and recording skills. As part of our work on the pH scale, we have been investigating the acidity of different sweets. We learnt that sweets were mainly acidic and therefore, the importance of having good dental hygiene to prevent tooth decay. We have also been learning about the Periodic Table and how the chemical elements are organised in groups depending on their properties.

In P.E. and Games, we have been working on developing our Tag Rugby skills. This has involved working on our hand eye coordination, spatial awareness, the ability of working as team and the importance of fair play.

In Art, we have been learning how to draw portraits and using different pencils to show tone. We have also been looking at Tudor portraits including those of Elizabeth  $1^{st}$  and how symbolism was used to portray characteristics.


