

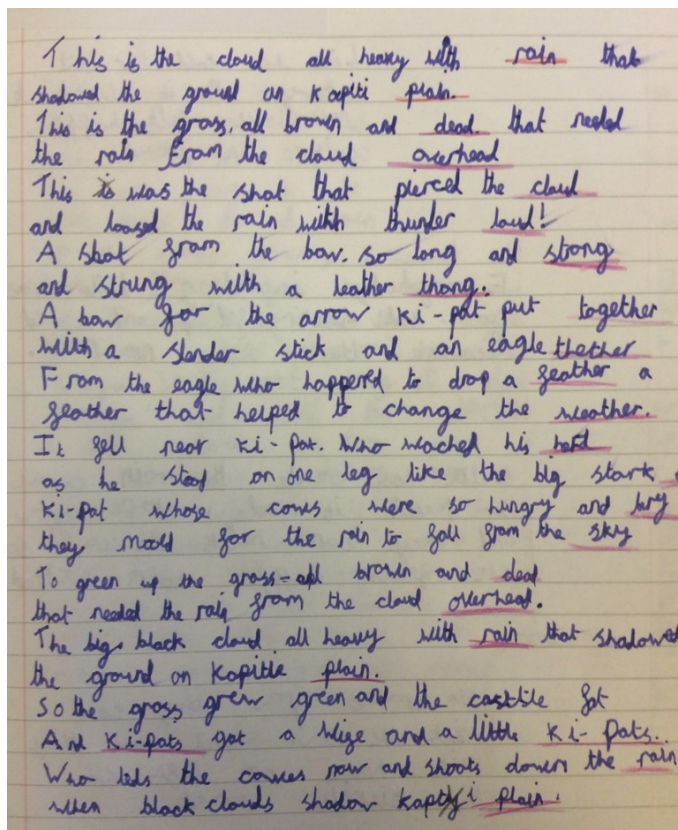

Nightingale Class Update

Nightingale Class is really enjoying their new topic of Amazing Africa and we are only three weeks into the term! So far we have learnt a lot about the country of Kenya including important cities and landmarks. This week, we looked at the world famous Masai Mara National Reserve and learning what its purpose is, before completing map work skills using a compass. The children are excited to be learning about African animals next week.

Sticking to the topic of Africa, we have read two stories in English that are African tales about Kenya. "Bringing the Rain to Kapiti Plain" was the first story we read; we looked at the rhyming patterns throughout the story and identified rhyming couplets. This week, we have read "Lila and the Secret of the Rain" and have written a diary entry as the main character – Lila. The children have been working really hard to ensure that their writing is neatly joined and presented and have produced some beautiful pieces of writing in their English books.



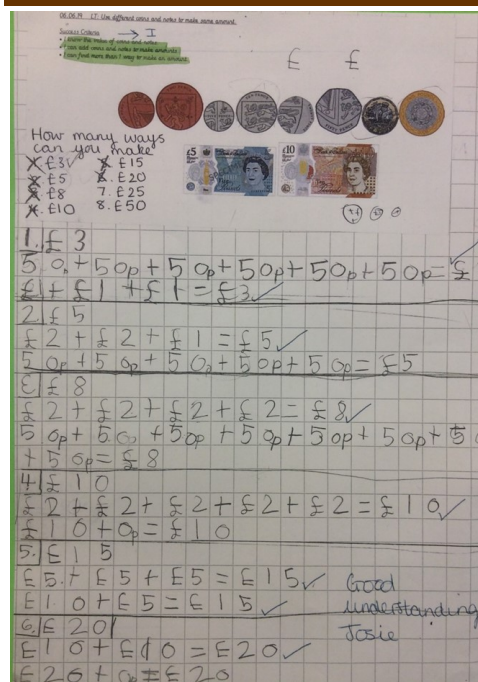
Nightingale Class Update Cont...

We have also produced some very colourful artwork, including African animal sunset pictures, traditional mud hut models, African necklaces and African headwear. Later on in the term, we will be making African masks.

In maths we have been working with money, trying to make amounts in different ways. We have also been finding change from an amount. Alongside this, we have been practising telling the time which is very tricky, but we have worked really hard!

Please do ask the children to read the time to 15 minutes (5 minutes for some!) so they can show off their skills and knowledge.

The children have been really excited about computing this term as we are making an animated e-book on PurpleMash about an African animal of their choice. So far, we have drawn our animal characters and started adding the text to the story. We will then add animation and sound. We cannot wait to read (and watch) the finished stories at the end of term.

Boys

- Black or grey trousers/shorts
- White shirt with a Sandhurst tie, or a white polo shirt
- Brown Sandhurst jumper/sweatshirt
- Black or grey socks
- **Black shoes (no trainers)**

Girls

- Brown skirt or pinafore
- Black or grey trousers
- White shirt/blouse with a Sandhurst tie, or a white polo shirt
- Brown Sandhurst jumper/cardigan/sweatshirt
- Black or grey socks
- Brown or black tights
- **Black, flat shoes (not trainers, boots or sandals)**



In addition

- A brown Sandhurst fleece may be worn as an extra layer
- **Girls may choose to wear a yellow gingham dress in the summer**
