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### Blend” - after school teen café/club

Held in the Mission Church building, Sandhurst, a central point in the village, Blend will be held on a Tuesday from 3.45pm – 5.45pm. We aim to provide a safe space where teens can come to meet with their friends after the school bus has dropped them off, and take part in games and activities (pool, table tennis, board games, crafts), and enjoy milkshakes, cakes and healthier snacks.

At present, our young people have nowhere to go in the village, and our hope is that Blend will create strong relationships with the young people, and also their families.

This project is already running successfully at St Mary’s Church in Goudhurst. Between 25 and 40 young people regularly attend Blend Goudhurst.

With the mental health and wellbeing of young people a primary concern in our communities Blend offers not only an opportunity to build friendships between the church and the young people, but also a place for them to be able to talk to mature, safe and caring adults in confidence and without judgement.

There are many “add-on” opportunities once Blend is established – counselling drop ins, debt advice, healthy relationship courses – as well as our hope to join up with other “Blends” in the local area to run activity away days during the school holidays for the young people.

We aim to start Blend Sandhurst in September 2019.
