## **Glossary**

<b>Buddha</b> The founder of Buddhism and a title given to someone who has found enlightenment.
<b>cremated</b> When a dead body has been burnt in a furnace until it turns to ash.
<b>death</b> When someone dies.
funerals Ceremonies usually involving burial or cremation to remember someone's life.
<b>hell realm</b> The most terrible of the six realms, a place of torment where everyone is angry and people fight.
<b>hungry ghosts</b> One of the six realms containing people who are addicted to or obsessed about something.
<b>karma</b> The concept that all actions have a consequence.
<b>legacy</b> Something important left behind for someone else.
<b>memorials</b> Objects to honour the memory of a person or event.
<b>monks</b> Men who give up wordly things such as a house, job or partner to follow their religion all the time.





monuments Structures built in memory of someone or something e.g. a statue.
<b>Nirvana</b> The highest spiritual state a Buddhist can reach by getting rid of greed, hatred, ignorance and desire.
<b>obituary</b> An announcement that a person has died and a short description of their life (usually found in a newspaper).
realms The six states of existence in which Buddhists believe they are reborn: heaven, humanity, Titans or angry gods, hungry ghosts, animals and hell.
Wheel of Life The cycle of life; suffering, death and rebirth.
<b>stupas</b> Buddhist monuments under which relics are usually buried.
