| A long upright bar with a horizontal bar across it, which is the symbol of the crucifixion. |
| ft |
| crucifix A model of the cross with a figure of Jesus on it. |
| disciple |
| A follower of a religious leader. |
| Easter Sunday |
| The day that Christians remember the resurrection of Jesus. |
| Eucharist |
| A ritual involving bread and wine based on the last supper Jesus had with his disciples. |
| Good Friday |
| The day of the crucifixion when Jesus died on the cross. |

| hymn A song sung during worship. |
| Maundy Thursday The Thursday before Good Friday that commemorates the last supper. |
| Orthodox A branch of the Christian church. |
| Palm cross Palm leaves folded into a cross to celebrate Palm Sunday. |
| Palm Sunday The day Jesus arrived in Jerusalem. |
| Paschal candle A candle lit the day before Easter Sunday and placed at the altar. |
| Passover An eight-day festival that celebrates the freeing of the Israelite slaves from Egypt. |
| paten A plate used to carry bread during the Eucharist. |
| pysanky egg A traditional Ukrainian Easter symbol decorated with brightly-coloured patterns. |
| resurrection Three days after the crucifixion when Jesus rose from the dead. |
| symbol An object or image that represents something else. |
| tomb A place where someone is buried – Jesus' tomb was empty after his resurrection. |
| wine A drink made with grapes that is offered to people during Holy Communion. |
