<b>abbey</b> A religious building where monks and/or nuns live.
almsgiving Giving money or food to people in need.
Asia A continent next to Europe.
<b>Buddhist</b> Someone who follows the teachings of Buddha.
<b>Christian</b> Someone who follows the teachings of Jesus Christ.
<b>community</b> A group of people who live in the same area or have similar interests or beliefs.
<b>Dalai Lama</b> The spiritual leader of Tibet.
<b>Dharma</b> The teachings of Buddha including the Four Noble Truths and the Eightfold Path.
<b>Eight Requisites</b> Eight basic things Buddhist nuns and monks are allowed to have; an outer robe, inner robe, thick robe for winter, alms bowl, razor, needle and thread, belt and water strainer.
generosity When you give or share with someone.
<b>Kathina</b> A celebration sometimes known as the Buddhist Lent involving a robe-giving



ceremony.



<b>meditation</b> To sit still and relax which calms your mind and body.
monastery A building where monks and nuns live and pray.
<b>monk</b> A man who gives up wordly things, such as a house, job or partner to follow their religion all the time.
<b>novice</b> The name given to someone who is preparing to become a Buddhist monk.
<b>nun</b> A woman who gives up worldly things such as a house, job or partner to follow her religion all the time.
retreat A place that people visit to relax, meditate or learn something new.
<b>robe</b> Traditional clothing for a Buddhist monk or nun made from rags of orange or dark red.
<b>Sangha</b> A Buddhist community including monks, nuns, laymen and laywomen.
spiritual A connection to something that is bigger than ourselves.
<b>Ten Precepts</b> These are rules that Buddhists must follow.
<b>Vassa</b> The 'Rains Retreat' which takes place during the three-month rainy season.
vihara A type of Buddhist monastery with an open court where monks stay during Vassa.
