
Our eldest children have successfully taken on the 'mantle' of leaders around school. We have chosen our new school captains – Alexander and Ellie too. We also have a new school council team.

#### **Potter Class Update**





I hope you all have a lovely weekend and keep up the reading!









## **Darwin Class Update**

It has been a great start to the school year for Shakespeare Class. We have enjoyed welcoming some new


