wonderful production of 'Aladdin Trouble' and our summer fair brought the whole school community together for an afternoon of fun and fundraising.






We also welcomed our new EYFS children with a delightful Teddy Bears' Picnic hosted by Miss Abel, her team and our new Year 5 buddies.








# Pankhurst Class Update

In science, we've been investigating light and shadows. The children explored how shadows change, using torches, and were fascinated by how light behaves in different conditions.


During our DT lessons, we've been learning about different types of greenhouses. We studied their structures and designs, and the children are now beginning to make their very own mini greenhouses.


Kwik cricket has been a highlight this term! The children have shown incredible team spirit and determination. Their batting and fielding skills have come on in leaps and bounds.

It's that time of year when we have to say a very fond farewell to the incredible Year 6 class of 2025! And what a fabulous term we have had, celebrating their primary school years!


